



How business operations teams can use Codex

Use Codex to turn dashboards, trackers, planning docs, and meeting notes into an operating brief with clear owners.

Why Codex for business operations

Business operations teams are the people everyone asks, "where does this stand?" The answer is usually spread across dashboards, trackers, meeting notes, and Slack. Codex can pull the current picture together and turn operating noise into decisions, owners, and next steps.

Sample prompt set for an operating brief

I'm preparing the self-serve onboarding review. Use the KPI dashboard, workstream tracker, weekly business review deck, #self-serve-onboarding thread, March planning doc, ops notes, and budget assumptions. Write a one-page brief with changes, blockers, decisions, owners, and missing data.

Update the April weekly business review deck from the same sources.

Turn onboarding blockers into a tracker with owner, due date, dependency, and next step.

Draft a decision memo on whether to fund the onboarding automation work.

Compare the current onboarding process doc against the blocker tracker.

Write a Slack update with progress, blockers, decisions needed, and owners.
