



How marketing teams can use Codex

Use Codex to turn launch docs, trackers, staging pages, and Slack threads into a launch brief and follow-up drafts.

Why Codex for marketing

Marketing teams live in the messy middle of a launch. The plan, tracker, page copy, and Slack thread rarely agree at first. Codex can pull the signals together, show what needs a decision, and turn the work into drafts, plans, briefs, and follow-ups.

Sample prompt set for a launch brief

I'm working on the Admin Controls launch. Use the launch doc, product notes, tracker, agency brief, staging pages, and Slack planning thread. Write a launch review brief that includes what's shipping, who it's for, key messages, open questions, decisions needed, and risks.

Draft the customer email, internal announcement, and social post from the same sources.

Turn the launch tracker into a two-week content plan with owners and dates.

Create an agency brief with audience, goal, message, proof points, and open questions.

Review staging pages for broken links, old names, weak calls to action, and message gaps.

Write a Slack update with progress, blockers, owners, and next steps.
